On November 1st, Natalie was transferred to Weisman Children's Rehabilitation Hospital for continued medical treatment. She has been progressing nicely and is now walking, talking, and will hopefully have a full recovery and a return to her second grade classroom in Centre City Elementary school in Mantua Township.



Parker Thoden is a fun loving 1st grader at HTS currently undergoing treatment for a relapse of PPB (a rare childhood lung cancer). He has just successfully completed his 5 week radiation treatment and is continuing to push through his remaining chemotherapy. Parker is looking forward to completing his treatment and a return to normal life.
